

e are in nostalgic mode in this month's *Dancing*times, and there is also a distinct Russian flavour to the contents. To mark the 50th anniversary of the Maryinsky Ballet's first performances in London, we publish on pages 34–35 a selection of Frederika Davis' wonderful photographs of some of the great Russian ballet stars of the past, and on page 15 Zoë Anderson interviews the US-born star of American Ballet Theatre, David Hallberg, who will be appearing with the Maryinsky as a guest artist at Covent Garden. Zoë Anderson was born in Edinburgh, and saw her first dance performances at the Festival there. She is the dance critic of *The Independent*, and has also written for *The Independent on Sunday*, *The Scotsman* and *Dancing*times. In 2002, she received her doctorate from the University of York for a thesis on "Nationhood and epic romance: Ariosto, Sidney, Spenser". She is the author of *The Royal Ballet: 75 Years*, published in April 2006. Zoë joined *Dancing*times as editorial assistant in June 2010.
