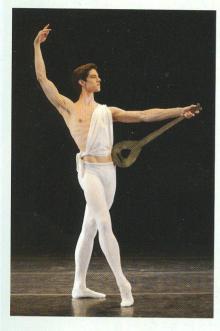

Contributors

Zoë Anderson was born in Edinburgh, and saw her first dance performances at the Festival there. She is the dance critic of *The Independent*, and has also written for *The Independent on Sunday* and *The Daily Telegraph*. In 2002, she received her doctorate from the University of York for a thesis on "Nationhood and epic romance: Ariosto, Sidney, Spenser". She is the author of *The Royal Ballet: 75 Years*, published in April 2006. Zoë joined *Dancing*times as editorial assistant in June 2010.

Paul Aprowsmith is an alumnus of Bolton School and the University of Kent, where he designed productions of works by Ibsen, Sophocles and Shakespeare. The first ballet he saw, *The Fountain of Bakchisarai* performed by the Bolshoi in the Palace of Congresses in the Kremlin, Moscow, in 1975, created an indelible impression. A career in international public relations has allowed opportunities to witness dance performances in the US, South Africa, France, Italy and Russia, from where he has contributed reviews for ballet. co. A former development director of Spitalfields Market Opera he is currently a director of Parrabbola, a community theatre production company.

Kevin Berry edits *The Stage*'s dance supplements. Based in North Yorkshire he reviews both drama and dance, having been encouraged to write about dance by Christopher Gable. Kevin has a deep interest in the education work of dance companies.

Patricia Linton joined The Royal Ballet in 1964 as a dancer, and went on to become assistant ballet mistress and company teacher. In 1974 she joined The Royal Ballet Lower School at White Lodge as a teacher, remaining there until 2001. She co-authored *The Young Dancer* with Darcey Bussell and in 2003 set up Voices of British Ballet, an oral history archive. She teaches at Central School of Ballet and guest teaches elsewhere.

Graham Watts is a freelance dance writer and critic. He writes for *Dancing*times, Londondance.com, Dancetabs.com and other magazines and websites in Europe, Japan and the US and contributes features to Sadler's Wells, the Edinburgh International Festival and many theatres around the world. He is chairman of the Dance Critics' Circle and of the National Dance Awards in the UK. His book, *Agony and Ecstasy*, written with the Czech ballerina Daria Klimentová, was published in March 2013.
