

Jonathan Gray is editor of *Dancing*times. He studied at The Royal Ballet School, Leicester Polytechnic, and Wimbledon School of Art, graduating with a BA Hons in Theatre Design. For 16 years he was a member of the curatorial department of the Theatre Museum, London, where he helped with the recreation of original designs for a number of productions by The Royal Ballet. He is co-author of the book *Unleashing Britain: Theatre gets real 1955-64*, published in 2005.

Marina Grut studied at the University of Cape Town Ballet School. She was co-founder of the Spanish Dance Society (1965) and author of *The History of Ballet in South Africa*, *The Bolero School* and *Spanish Dance*. In 1989 King Juan Carlos I named her Dame of the Order of Queen Isabella of Spain in recognition of her presentation and preservation of Spanish dance and music.

David Jays is editor of *Dance Gazette* and also writes about books, film and performance. He keeps a blog at artsjournal.com/performancemonkey.

Matthew Paluch trained at The Royal Ballet School, graduating in 1997. During his ten-year career as a professional dancer he performed with London City Ballet, Scottish Ballet, K-Ballet and English National Ballet. On leaving the stage in 2006 Matthew acquired a teaching diploma from the RAD, and completed an MA in Ballet Studies at Roehampton University. He currently teaches ballet and repertoire at all levels both nationally and internationally, and writes for theartsdesk.com.

Sanjoy Roy is a writer, editor and designer. Formerly editor of Dance Now and extraDiTion magazines, he has contributed to Dance Now, Dance Theatre Journal, Animated and Tanssi, written programme notes for several companies, as well as chapters for the books White Man Sleeps (1999) and Dance in the City (1997). He has won design awards for Dance Now, a magazine award for extraDiTion, and was a finalist in the BPIF 2001 Book Design and Production Awards for Moving Music.
