Rahvusooper Estonia korraldab heategevusliku galakontserdi „Estonia Ukraina heaks“, mille tulu läheb uue Estonia klaveri soetamiseks Slovjanski kaunite kunstide kooli õpilastele. Klassikalise kavaga kontserdil astuvad estoonlaste kõrval üles Ukraina Rahvusooperi solistid ning balleti esisolistid. Kontserdil esineb sõnavõtuga Donetskist pärit Rahvusooper Estonia solist Pavlo Balakin. Kontserdi toetussumma on määramata – iga külastaja saab ise valida kui palju soovib heategevuskontserdil annetada. Kohad saalis palume kokku leppida Rahvusooper Estonia kassas, tel 683 1210 või estonia@opera.ee. Lisaks saab toetust avaldada pangalaekandega Rahvusooper Estonia kontole EE351010002011259003 märgusõnaga „Ukraina“ või pannes annetatava summa 29. septembrist teatris asuvasse toetuskastidesse. Annetada saab 1. detsembrini.

Slovjansk asub Ida-Ukrainas, seal elab ligi 100 000 elanikku. Linnas, millest sõda üle käis, toimuvad hetkel ülesehitustööd. Ulatuslikult sai kannatada ka Slovjanski kaunite kunstide kool, kus pärast taastamistöid õpib 600 last valitud erialal – laulmine, pillimäng, ballett, kujutav kunst. Koolis on 300kohaline saal ja 70ndatel soetatud Estonia klaver, mille asemele heade annetajate abiga soetatakse uus.

Estonian National Opera holds a charity concert "Estonia for Ukraine" in order to use the money raised from the donations to purchase a new Estonia Piano for the pupils of Sloviansk School of Fine Arts. Together with the soloists of the Estonian National Opera and Ballet the soloists and principal dancers of the National Opera of Ukraine will perform. The program features pieces from classical repertoire. A native of Donetsk and a soloist of the Estonian National Opera, Pavlo Balakin will give a speech. There is no fixed price for the concert – everyone can decide how much they want to donate. In addition, it is possible to support the project with a money transfer to the bank account of the Estonian National Opera EE351010002011259003 with the keyword "Ukraine". Donations are also collected into the charity boxes available in the Estonian National Opera beginning from September 29. It is possible to make donations until December 1.

Sloviansk has a population of about 100 000 and is situated in eastern Ukraine. The war-ravished city is currently being rebuilt. The Sloviansk School of Fine Arts suffered considerable damage, but after repair works has 600 pupils studying singing, instruments, ballet or visual arts. The school has an auditorium of 300 seats and an Estonia Piano bought in the 70s that will now be replaced with a new one with the help of kind donators.
